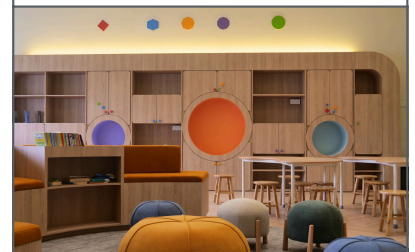

To the editorial team: we're incredibly proud of you. Being recognised on a national stage is no small feat, and this is just the beginning of your journey.

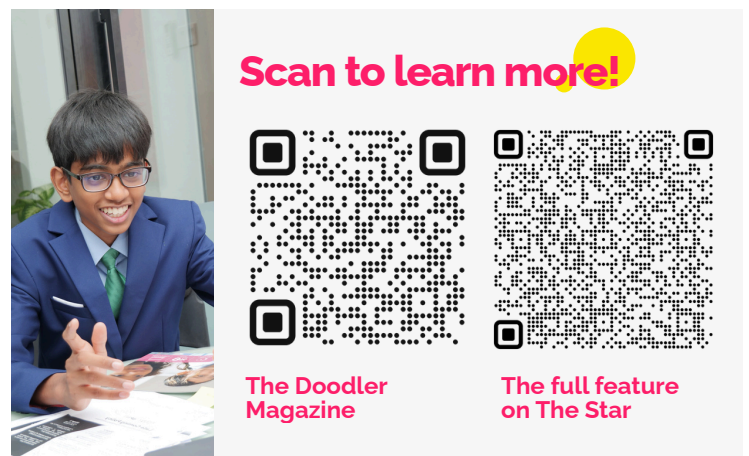

- **Phonics levels consistently above UK standards**
- **GLD (Good Level of Development) scores consistently above the UK average**

These results reflect the success of our play-based, nurturing approach to learning, which provides a strong foundation for each child's development.

### 02 | The Power of Play: Early Years' Trip

Play is at the heart of Early Years learning. Our children recently embarked on a delightful trip to **We.Play**, where they were given the perfect opportunity to explore, create, and connect through meaningful play experiences. From the moment they arrived, they were immersed in a beautifully stimulating environment that sparked curiosity, creativity, and independent exploration.

### 02 | Sports Day in Full Swing

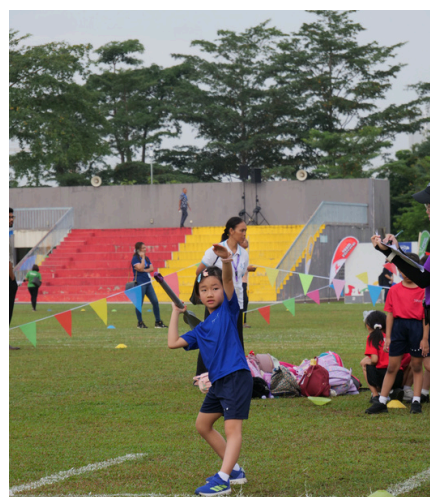
Sekolah Sri Tenby's **Primary Sports Day** was a joyful celebration filled with energy, excitement, and proud moments.

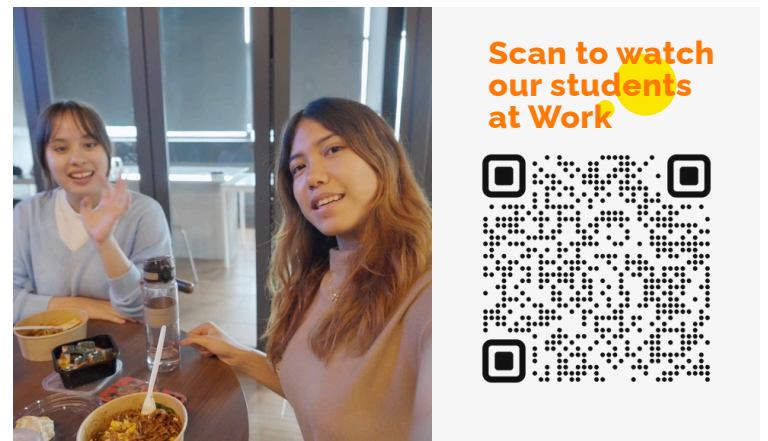

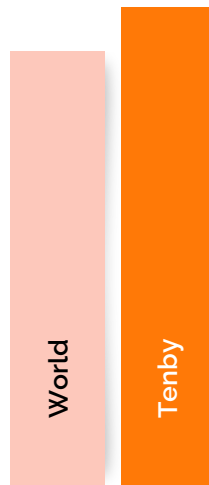

I joined Tenby in 2016 as an Executive Trainee under the previous owner of Tenby. To be honest, coming from a small town in Pahang and fresh out of university, I wasn't very confident in my English at the time. The transition was tough. I still remember walking into the campus for the first time and being completely shocked by how big it was — it felt unreal, like something I'd only ever seen on TV.



I struggled to settle in and often felt out of place, especially coming from a very different background. My confidence was really low back then, and there were moments when everything felt overwhelming.

But looking back, those challenges became the starting point of my growth. With time, patience, and a lot of support from the people around me, I slowly found my footing. I didn't just grow as a person — I grew together with Tenby.



Over 10 years, I've seen the school grow into a really strong, caring community. There's a positive learning environment, a genuine sense of belonging, and I've always felt safe here. Seeing happy students, teachers, and staff says a lot about our culture, and even during tough times, we've always supported one another and grown together.

Since joining Tenby, I've grown a lot, both personally and professionally. In the beginning, I struggled with confidence, communication, and believing in myself. Working in a fast-paced, diverse environment taught me how to adapt, stay resilient, and handle challenges better. With the guidance and support of my team and manager, I grew not just in skills but also in empathy and understanding.



Today, I'm a senior team member who can be relied on to lead and support others. Because I know how hard it can be to settle into a new place, I always try to support new staff, students, and parents — just as I was once supported.

## Are there any moments or interactions on campus that have left a lasting impact on you?

Some of the most meaningful moments for me have come from working with students and colleagues, especially during entry assessments. In the past, alongside enrolments and visas, I was also involved in conducting and arranging entry assessments, often for Standard 1 students.



Each assessment meant spending one to two hours with a child, and those moments stayed with me. After they joined the school, some would excitedly call out "Ms Bella" when they saw me around campus, while others would run up for a hug. Even now, when I bring prospective parents on school tours, some students still wave at me from their classrooms.

Looking back, these moments mean more to me than I ever expected. When I was choosing my path at Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), I deliberately pursued Geography within the School of Humanities — not Education — because I never imagined myself working with children or entering the education field at all.



Yet 10 years later, here I am, building a career in education and working closely with students aged 3 to 18. It's funny how life turns out. Those small, everyday connections with students remind me how unexpected this journey has been and why my time at Tenby Schools Setia Eco Park continues to be so meaningful.

## What's one memorable story you'll always remember about Tenby Schools Setia Eco Park?

One moment I'll always remember is my first successful enrolment during my trainee days. A Chinese family from Singapore visited the school when my senior colleagues weren't around, and I did my best to explain everything, with limited knowledge of the International Curriculum and English skills. What stayed with me was their kindness and patience. They listened carefully, asked simple questions, and in their own way, encouraged me when I needed it most. They eventually enrolled their daughter, and their family became part of the Tenby community.



Even after all these years, they still send me Hari Raya wishes without fail. That experience reminded me that sincerity, effort, and human connection matter most — and it's something I will always associate with Tenby Schools Setia Eco Park.

Over the years, I've grown in ways I didn't expect — especially in confidence, resilience and empathy. Professionally, I still see myself as a learner. There's always more to discover, more to refine, and new challenges to step into.

Moving forward, I hope to keep learning from the people around me — colleagues, students, parents and staff alike. My goal is simple: to stay open to feedback, keep improving, and continue contributing positively to the Tenby community, both professionally and personally.
