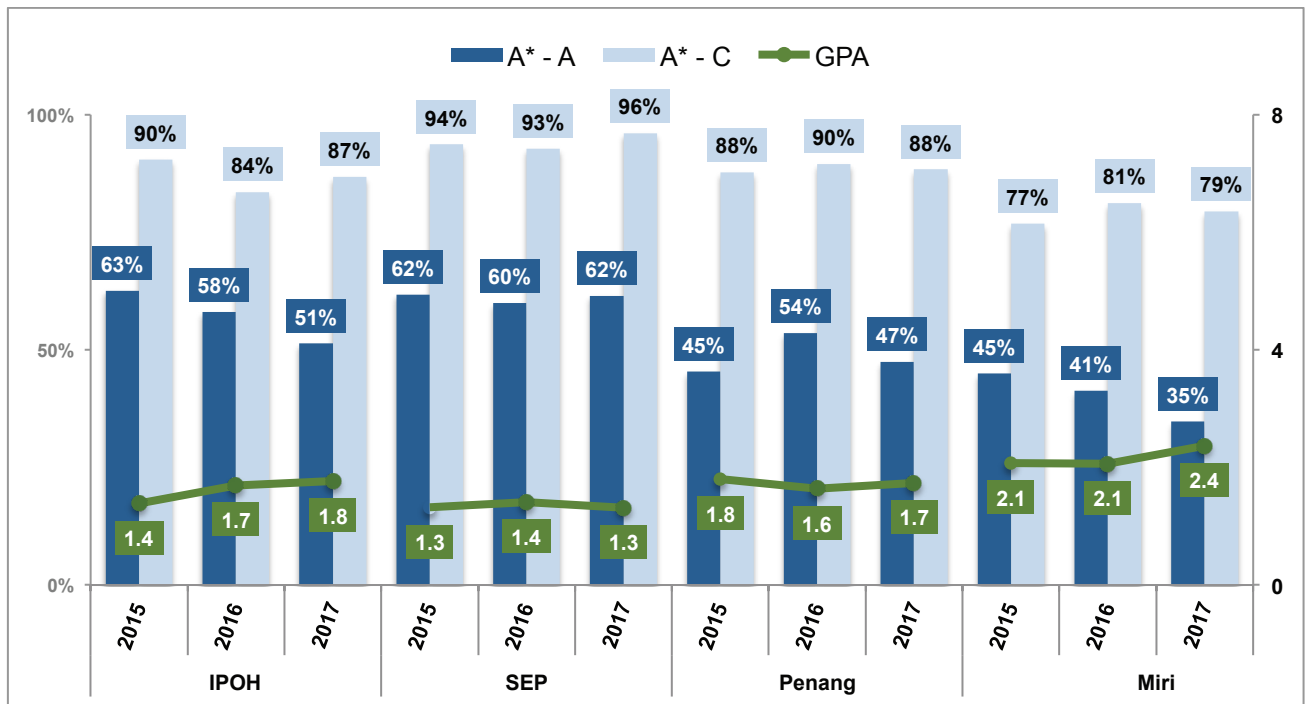

It is very pleasing to note that, except for Design & Technology, French and PE, the average IGCSE subject results for Tenby Schools are well above world averages. This also reflects an improvement from 2016, with Business Studies, 2nd Language English and 1st Language Chinese no longer below world averages.

Overall, Tenby Schools IGCSE results for 2017 (without SEG results due in December) show a slight drop in performance compared to the results in the last 2 years (2015 & 2016), namely in the A* - A and GPA averages.

SEP shows exceptional results, with 100% Pass Rate and 13 students (10.8%) scoring 9A*/A and above, followed by Penang with 3 students (4.2%), Ipoh with 3 students (3.9%) and Miri with 1 student (4.5%). SEP also shows an improvement in the GPA compared to 2016, with 15 out of 22 subjects (68%) reflecting an increase.

Overall, for the last 2 years, Design & Technology and PE have remained the weakest subjects across the group compared to the world averages.
